Board of Education* decision when one Virginia school system refused to integrate. In the wake of the Supreme Court's unanimous *Brown v. Board of Education* decision, Virginia's Prince Edward County refused to obey the law. Rather than desegregate, the county closed its public schools, locking and chaining the doors. The

community's white leaders quickly established a private academy, commandeering supplies from the shuttered public schools to use in their all-white classrooms. Meanwhile, black parents had few options: keep their kids at home, move across county lines, or send them to live with relatives in other states. For five years, the schools remained closed. Kristen Green, a longtime newspaper reporter, grew up in Farmville and attended Prince Edward Academy, which did not admit black students until 1986. In her journey to uncover what happened in her hometown before she was born, Green tells the stories of families divided by the school closures and of 1,700 black children denied an education. As she peels back the layers of this haunting period in our nation's past, her own family's role—no less complex and painful—comes to light. At once gripping, enlightening, and deeply moving, *Something Must Be Done About Prince Edward County* is a dramatic chronicle that explores our troubled racial past and its

reverberations today, and a timeless story about compassion, forgiveness, and the meaning of home.

An Examination for Teachers of Wake County Public Schools Jul 28 2020

We Can Do It Aug 29 2020 This book tells of the challenges faced by white and black school administrators, teachers, parents, and students as Alachua County, Florida, moved from segregated schools to a single, unitary school system. After *Brown v. Board of Education*, the South's separate white and black schools continued under lower court opinions, provided black students could choose to go to white schools. Not until 1968 did the NAACP Legal Defense Fund convince the Supreme Court to end dual school systems. Almost fifty years later, African Americans in Alachua County remain divided over that outcome. A unique study including extensive interviews, *We Can Do It* asks important questions, among them: How did both races, without precedent, work together to

create desegregated schools? What conflicts arose, and how were they resolved (or not)? How was the community affected? And at a time when resegregation and persistent white-black achievement gaps continue to challenge public schools, what lessons can we learn from the generation that desegregated our schools?

Negro Students Locked Out of Public Schools for Five Years, September 1959-September 1964

Feb 03 2021 Negro students, as they were called in the era of interest, were locked out of the Prince Edward County, Virginia, public schools from September 1959 - September 1964. A private school system for the sons and daughters of the oppressor opened in September 1959. This premiere publication is the largest collection of accounts from individuals in the community of the oppressed that were locked out of the Prince Edward County public schools during the education crisis. The stories in this rare valued collection shared primarily by the oppressed only provide a mere glimpse of

community and home life during those challenging, regrettable, and horrific years. Very captivating in this volume are the stories of individuals that were locked out of the Prince Edward County public schools and who in adult life devoted themselves to the teaching profession. Most of the school teachers in this volume taught in schools in Virginia. A small number taught in other States. The most intriguing element among the teachers is comprised of individuals that were locked out of the Prince Edward County public schools, but enjoyed a rewarding career as teachers in the same public school system that denied them an education for five consecutive years. There are in this publication the painful and agonizing reflections of persons who shared about never coming close to achieving their childhood dreams and ambitions, which required an education. Many students because of the interruption of their education during the critical foundational formative learning years were

unable to sufficiently recover and master the proficiency required to progress and develop intellectually at a rate that permitted them to pursue lofty goals in life.

Lessons for PreK-3rd from Montgomery County Public Schools. An FCD Case Study

Oct 31 2020 Reading achievement in the United States has stagnated. In 2009, only 33 percent of Fourth Graders were proficient or above in reading--a mere two percentage points higher than in 1998. At the same time, double-digit achievement gaps between African American and Latino/Hispanic students and their white counterparts have changed little in nearly two decades. More troubling, there are few examples of system-wide success stories--school districts that have improved equity and overall student achievement. Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) in Maryland is one such example. Since 1998, the district's population of English Language Learners increased 103 percent and the number of students receiving a

free or reduced lunch went up 44 percent. During the same period, MCPS improved the proportion of Third Graders reading proficiently or above to 88.9 percent, shrank its Third Grade reading achievement gap by 29 percentage points, and increased the number of students taking at least one Advanced Placement exam by 25 percentage points to 61.5 percent--almost 2.5 times that of the national average. In addition, nearly 77 percent of all graduating seniors enroll in college. So, how did MCPS accomplish this even as its demographics rapidly changed? It started early, at the beginning of the education "value chain" and made large and consistent investments in early learning. Today, 91 percent of MCPS Kindergartners enter First Grade ready to learn, reading at text level 4 or above according to the standards-based Assessment Program in Primary Reading. This paper presents lessons drawn from Montgomery County Public Schools. A glossary of programs, plans and initiatives is included. (Contains 6
